- April 3, 2023: Mayra Medina made a motion to approve the meeting minutes as written. Motion seconded by LeeAnn Holland. No discussion/additions/changes. The motion unanimously passes.

4:20 V. Community Updates......Carole Shelton, Chair

- What's new in your agency/district/organization that supports families or students with disabilities?
 - LeeAnn Holland, Conejo. Shared the District Special Education Advisory Council has their final meeting next week and there will be presentations by three committees. The Safety Committee focusses on Restorative Justice. The district has offered training in Restorative Justice and the committee would like to make sure students with disabilities are thought about during that process. Curriculum and Inclusion committee, led by LeeAnn Holland. Focusing on asking questions and meeting with administrators, talking about co-teaching specific reading instruction for students with intellectual, developmental and learning disabilities. Making sure everything is evidenced-based and consistent and pathway and scope along the way. Lastly, LeeAnn shared that the Disabilities Celebration Toolkit is being updated. Announced Conejo, at Newbury Park High School is hosting the annual Special Olympics event on May 20th.
 - Amanda Alfred, Pleasant Valley. Amanda shared the PTAs in the school district honored a couple of amazing people that have helped out students with special needs. The speech and language pathologist along with a couple of special day teachers were honored. There is an addition to the Pleasant Valley Special Education Padlet, has a google form about questions about your IEP or special education, and the questions will be answered within 1-3 days. Shared also on the padlet is a flyer that SELPA is offering de-escalating challenging behaviors training this coming Friday, May 5th.

- Katie Spore, Fillmore. Katie Shared they just finished open house for the elementary sites. The middle and high school open houses are held later in the month. Katie shared that she was excited when one of the students who is mainstreamed for part of the day in her class showed up in her classroom for open house. It was the highlight of her day.
- Socorro Eilar gave a shout out to the legal clinic for being helpful. They
 have excellent webinars. Shared there is a documentary coming out
 called SPELLERS, about nonspeakers with Autism. LeeAnn Holland
 shared there is a screening of SPELLERS on May 6th at 6:00 p.m. at the
 Borchard Community Center.
- Ashley Pope, President of Autism Society of Ventura County. Shared they had 11th annual Aut. to Run yesterday with 3000 participants and 2500 walkers/runners. Largest resource faire with over 70 resource booths and more parents than ever coming for the first time. First time had major sponsors that are not autism businesses such as T Mobile Foundation.
- Simone Mongiello, CCS –Unit in Conejo being moved to Glenwood. Shared that at the last Board of Supervisor's meeting, the medical therapy program was highlighted as the moment of inspiration. Simone is part of a nonprofit organization called OT/PT Inc., which brings in continuing education courses for pediatric therapists. She is happy to share when courses are offered. Lastly, one of the therapists is working on having a park day at Arroyo Verde, which has an inclusive play area. The date is yet to be determined.
- Monica Torres, VCBH. Shared that VCBH continues internal and external collaboration. A follow-up from last time; ICPM finished their training collaboration and continue to enhance accessibility.
- Brenda Hurtado, Tri-Counties Regional Center-Have experienced lots
 of growth within the agency. Now have an office in Fillmore and have
 Rainbow Connection there-The littles are being supported out of 2
 offices-Simi and Oxnard; More growth in the future. Grow at Oxnard
 location as well. Have hybrid team that covers transition and adults
 and a second children's team. The new services, now funding social
 recreation and camp again. Working on how will benefit families.
 Service Coordinators are pushing out information during family
 meetings.
- Emily Mostovoy-Luna, Associate Superintendent. Emily shared that tomorrow she and LeeAnn Holland would travel to Sacramento for legislative sharing day. They will meet with Assembly member Bennett and Senator Limone. Will partner with Santa Barbara SELPA when meeting with Senator Limone and will focus on legislative priorities. Specifically, SELPA sponsored bills. One related to inclusive practices and UDL SB354 and administrative credentials program, course work specifically in inclusive practices and UDL. (B1517) Codifying the roles of SELPA. Looking at where SELPAs are directly supporting our districts.

- Next week is the culminating event with Shelley Moore and Katie Novak. Emily shared that she hopes everyone can join. If you can't join in person, there is a virtual option. Monday, May 8th, there will be site visits at Moorpark Unified and Oceanview School with a lunch meeting afterwards, engaging in a deep dive into the work we hope to do. Including students with disabilities throughout this event. Students are helping set up, center pieces are from Oxnard Union's post-secondary program, a welcome video from Triton Academy, and some other surprises. Trying to secure a graduate from a local district that is a DJ.
- Emily shared that we are the statewide lead in ADR. The appeal process has now ended. We will continue to support our local districts and broaden that support state-wide with Tehama County SELPA and Tehama County Office of Education and most importantly, with Rainbow Resource Family Empowerment Center. This is the only statewide lead grant that has a parent organization as the partner, ensuring the parent voice is at every meeting as we engage in this important work over the next 5 years.
- Carole Shelton-Carole shared Rainbow Family Resource Center supports anyone served by the Regional Center, 0 through end of life. They are also now a Family Empowerment Center, which allows them to expand their services to students with an IEP and will help both people served at the Regional Center and those with served through Tri-counties and are now a FEC and can support students w/an IEP. This will help those served by the Regional Center and those within our Ventura County SELPA area. Continue to run support groups, trying to bring them all back in person. Groups in Fillmore and Santa Paula are in person, Now have Down Syndrome in both English and Spanish, an Autism support group in both English and Spanish, and an early start support group in both English and Spanish. The Early Start group is held virtually. All the groups offered are on the web site. Continue with IEP training and support vendor connections with monthly visits to answer questions from staff about services and the process. Continue partnership with Amigo baby with weekly virtual instruction for little ones. Continue Zumba virtually and First 5 comes out to Fillmore once a month.
